
Virtual Registrants are able to watch and

As we enter into the month of May and begin to explore the monthly theme of "Story", I would like to invite you to a special congregational event called "Who Are We?" led by the Transition Team and myself. We will gather together to tell stories about Emerson and its people that capture the essence of who Emerson is as a faith community. Who are you as a congregation? What values do you uphold in the everydayness of your coming together as a community?

Through the medium of storytelling, we will get at the core values that answer the question "Who are we?" As Emerson prepares to go into search for its next called and settled minister, knowing who you are as a congregation and being able to clearly identify your core values will help both the search committee and potential ministers discern who will be the next right minister for Emerson.

So, while this is important work for a congregation to undertake during the interim, it can also be both simple and fun. All you have to do is choose one of two dates, show up (on Zoom), and

have some paper and pens, maybe even some markers, colored pencils, or crayons at the ready. We will gather in community, tell stories, and identify up to five core values that characterize who Emerson is. These values will come to live in the forefront of everyday congregational life. You'll hear them preached in sermons and discussed at Board meetings. No getting bogged down in process or filed away in a document somewhere that hardly anyone ever remembers to look at. Simple. Fun. Useful!

Our hope is that each and every one of you will be able to join us so we are offering a choice of two dates: Wednesday, May 5<sup>th</sup> at 7 pm and Saturday, May 8<sup>th</sup> at 10 am.
